Severe Weather Policy

If there are severe weather conditions this winter, the library will close. The Lebanon Public Library will close if there is a countywide snow emergency. Other times the library may close due to severe weather, even if a snow emergency is not declared.



When the library is closed because of weather conditions, there will be no overdue fines charged for that day on any materials as long as they are returned the next day that the library is open.

Usually library closings are announced on channels 6, 8, and 13. Please call the library before getting out in inclement weather to verify that the library is open.

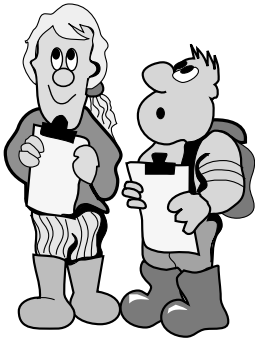

The Reference Department is very proud to announce that during the 2003 taxing season, over 19,000 Federal forms, Indiana forms and instructions were distributed in the front foyer of the Library. We will continue to have forms, instructions, reproducible forms and publications available as a public service to our community for the 2004 season as they arrive from January through April. The Lebanon Post Office will have a limited supply of forms available for pick up in their lobby during the hours that we are closed.

Tax forms are available online at www.irs.gov and www.in.gov throughout the year. We have computers that you may use or if you know the form you need, we will print it for you. Computer print outs are \$.10 a page and \$.15 a page for copies.

The Library Staff cannot and will not answer tax questions or give advice—check with a tax professional. If you are not sure which form to use, contact a professional.

Laura Zigman has sold the rights to her 2006 novel *A Wilderness of Moneys* to Tom Hanks' production company. Nia Vardalos from *My Big Fat Greek Wedding* will write and star in the film. The story revolves around a publicist turned housewife who heads back to work to revive the flagging career of a movie star.

United States Show**

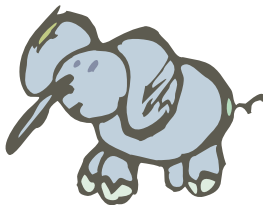

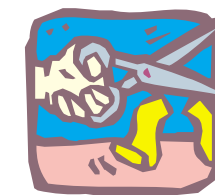
Story Times
