



Class Descriptions

9 a.m. to 12 noon classes

"You can Cane" Polymer Clay Millefiori Caning Made Easy - Lisa Galvin

Cost \$20 includes polymer clay, instructions and project sheets, as well as the use of other materials and tools during class time.

Learn how easy it is to create simple millefiori polymer clay canes. Manipulation techniques to create more complex design will be covered; making even beginners look like the pros in no time! All skill levels will enjoy this class. Students can use their canes to create beautiful beads, bauble, and buttons. A \$3.00 bracelet stringing kit for beads will be available during class. Need to Bring: shoe box with polyfil to take home your creations

Min 10/Max 30

"Fabric Painting-Linen Bookmark" - Nancy Leonard

Cost \$10 includes everything to complete the bookmark

Learn to do simple decorative painting on a linen bookmark using paints designed for fabric.

Min 1/Max 15

"Smocked Little Girl's Socks" - Scheryl Gaylor

Cost \$15 includes all kit materials

Learn to do the wave smocking stitch on the cuff of a little girl's eyelet trimmed pair of socks.

This is one of the basic stitches in smocking.

Min 1/Max15

Need to bring: scissors

"Beaded Donut Circles" - Mary Stasic

Cost \$15 includes all kit materials

Learn how to make a beaded Donut circles to use as a pendant or bracelet. This would be an intermediate beginner skill level class. Some beading experience is needed.

Need to bring: scissors and a bead mat if you have one or you can purchase it. Remember to bring your glasses!!

Min 6/Max 20

"7 Pocket Purse" - Junn Dunn

Cost \$20 Does not include a kit

A purse with 6 inside pockets and one outside will be made with double sided quilted fabric.

Need to bring: $1\frac{1}{2}$ yards of double sided quilted fabric, 18" zipper, thread to match, sewing machine in good working order, extension cord, #14 or 16 size sewing machine needle, pins, tape measure, sharp scissors, rotary cutter and mat if available. Optional: border fabric can be used to trim the purse at the top.

Min 3/Max 8

"Rug Hooking Footstool" - Lori Cravens

wooden footstool, pattern and wool.

Cost \$65 includes pattern complete with frame wool, footstool, and wool for pattern Learn to hook a footstool cover. Any skill level can do this. There will be a choice of three patterns. Instructions for hooking and completing the project will be provided as well as the

Need to bring: frame or hoop, scissors, wool cutter, and hook. If you are a beginner and need supplies, contact teacher prior to class.

Min 5/Max 20

"Knitting and Felting a small gift bag or little bag" - Mary Ann Lienhart-Cross

Cost \$20 includes wooden circular needles, pattern, darning needle, wool and decorative yarn. Learn to knit a small gift bag using circular needles. Wool and decorative yarn will be used. It will be knitted and felted in class. The class will also cover information on various yarns, stitches, and colors in felting as well as on hand and machine felting.

Need to bring: small scissors, ruler or tape measure, pencil/pen, and a positive attitude.

Min 7/Max15

"Quick Start Faux Finishing" - Chandy Weber

Cost \$30 includes everything

Learn 3 different finishes. Begin with a discussion on products and preparation. Then move into the process of faux finishing and decorative painting. There will be hands-on study of wall glazing, shimmer stone and leather. Students will take home their samples.

Need to bring: apron or old shirt since painting will be involved

Min 5/Max 10

<u>"Small Market Basket Weaving"</u> - Wanda Groves

Cost \$20 includes weaving materials

Learn to weave a small size market basket. The skill level is beginner to intermediate.

Need to bring: scissors, small screw driver or packing tool, spoke weight or small heavy hardback book to use as weight, 10 clothes pins, and small water bucket.

<u>"Herbs & More" and "Growing and Using Scented Geraniums</u>" - Cheryl Toney and Mark Davidson Cost \$15 includes all materials

Learn about herbs and scented geraniums. Make a kitchen wreath with these items.

Nothing to bring Min 5/ Max 12

"Basic Stringing" - Mary Staiic & Cheryl Beckage

Cost \$15 includes soft flex wire, crimps, beads, and toggle for bracelet

Learn the techniques necessary to make a single strand beaded bracelet. This is a beginner skill level class.

Min 6/Max 20

Need to bring: paper & pen for notes

<u>"Needle felting Hat"</u> - Carol Haughton

Cost \$40 includes fiber to make a hat using teacher's forms + tools

Learn to make a hat out of Alpaca fiber on a foam form with felting needles (dry method) can wear your hat home. No experience needed

Nothing to bring Min 3/Max 10

"Pen + Ink Style of Drawing and Calligraphy" - Becky Bewley

Cost \$30 includes paper, set of pens, and pencils

Learn 3 styles of calligraphy and as well as different pen and ink drawings techniques.

Need to bring: a favorite poem or saying to do in calligraphy (teacher will also have ones from which you can chose)

Min 5/Max 15

"Beginning Rosemaling-decorative painting on wood" - Jan Boettcher

Cost \$30 includes wooden project, paints, and supplies

Learn the art of rosemaling-Norwegian decorative painting-done on wood pieces.

Need to bring: paper and pen.

Min 5/Max 8

"Nuno Felting or Lamination Felting" - Patti Hodges and Nancy Talley

Cost \$ 40 includes materials for a scarf of silk gauze and fine merino wool for the top. Colors will vary but there will be a good selection.

Learn techniques of lamination wool to a base cloth. Nuno has become the craze in Europe and in fashion magazines. Make a lightweight draped wool and silk scarf. Beginners and intermediate felters will enjoy this class.

Need to bring: bath size towel, bubble wrap 12" wide by 6 feet long, sponge and optional rubber gloves

Min 8/Max 16

"Wool Drying Basket"-Peggy Boyd

Cost \$25 includes everything to make a wool drying basket

Learn to make this open bottom, square basket with feet to allow air flow. It is a very useful basket for other things as well.

Need to Bring: towel, scissors, bucket, screwdriver, and tape measure. Min 3 /Max 12

"Crochet Top Little Girl's Sun Dress" - Deanna Brueggert

Cost \$10 includes crochet thread, fabric to match, and thread.

Learn to crochet the yoke for a cute little girl's sun dress. Students should know the basics of crochet-beginner/intermediate skill.

Need to bring: Size F & G crochet hooks, scissors, small ruler or tape measure, and sewing needles.

Min 3/Max 12

"Needle Tatting-Basics" - Karen K. Niemeyer + Martha Jane Ottinger

Cost \$10 includes handouts, needle and tatting thread.

Learn needle tatting and make rings, picots and a chain. This is done using a needle not a shuttle. It is a beginning class for those who have never before tatted.

Need to bring: scissors, paper and pen for notes.

Min 2/Max 12

"Hardanger for Beginners" - Linda L. White

Cost \$25 includes fabric, needle, and 2 balls of pearl cotton thread

Learn to make a diamond shaped Christmas ornament. Student needs to be familiar with even weave needlework.

Need to bring: small sharp scissors

Min 4/Max 8




